Are We Neglecting the Lord's Supper?

There is a growing sound in the brotherhood that the church has been neglecting the Lord's supper. It is asserted by some that "pinching a cracker and sipping a cup" was not the way that the Lord's supper was originally practiced and that we need reform in this area of our worship. The reformers would change the Lord's supper into a less formal and more casual meal setting where each would eat a satisfying portion of bread and drink a satisfying portion of fruit of the vine (some say alcoholic wine) until everyone had received their fill. Is this really what the Lord's supper is all about? Jesus established the supper the night before his betrayal. In Matthew 26:26-29, Mark 14:22-25 and Luke 22:19,20 we read about this memorial meal.

First, Jesus limited and distributed the elements. He did not throw a basket of bread at the disciples and say, "Here, have your fill!" He did not keep refilling the cup over and over again until they had enough to drink. **Second**, the inauguration of the Lord's supper occurred during their Passover meal. Jesus merely takes the symbols of unleavened bread and fruit of the vine and makes use of them to

illustrate His body and blood. **Third**, it is clear from an honest reading of the text that it did not involve more than one moderate piece of bread and one moderate drink from a cup. The important thing was that it was the bread and cup that JESUS blessed and gave, just as He gave His body and blood. When all the disciples had eaten his own portion of bread and drank his own portion of the cup, the supper was done.

Fourth, Paul quite clearly forbids making a common meal out of the Lord's supper. This is exactly what the Corinthian brethren were doing. We read in 1 Corinthians 11:20-22 "When ye come together therefore into one place, this is not to eat the Lord's supper. For in eating every one taketh before other his own supper: and one is hungry, and another is drunken. What? have ye not houses to eat and to drink in? or despise ye the church of God, and shame them that have not? What shall I say to you? shall I praise you in this? I praise you not."

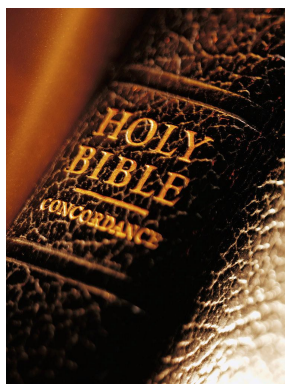
Clearly it was an abuse to use the Lord's Supper as an occasion to have a meal. Paul plainly states the pattern to them in the next verses. The Lord took bread, gave thanks, and gave it out. He did the same thing with the cup. We often use this to talk about the

pattern of the Lord's supper (and there IS one), but the instructions that Paul gave to the Corinthians were primarily to bring them back to an orderly (1 Corinthians 14:40) observance. This meaning is clear. 1) Everyone is supposed to partake of it (v.21). 2) It is NOT to be a common meal type setting (v.22). 3) It is to involve a LIMITED amount of the elements (not an UNLIMITED amount) (v.23-25). 4) It is to be a time of memorial and somber proclamation in reflection of the body and blood of Christ and His death (v.24-26). 5) It is SERIOUS business to partake in a manner that was less than worthy (v.27-32). 6) The brethren are to wait for everyone to partake before moving on to other matters of worship (v.33). 7) The hungry should eat at home because this meal is NOT about eating to satisfy hunger (v.34). People want to tamper with the Lord's Supper to make them feel better about partaking it and to "de-ritualize" it. But, it is not about how WE feel.

It is about what Christ did for us and for us to remember that event forever!

The Lord inaugurated this ritual; we should respect it. To those who don't, "What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you in this? I praise you not."

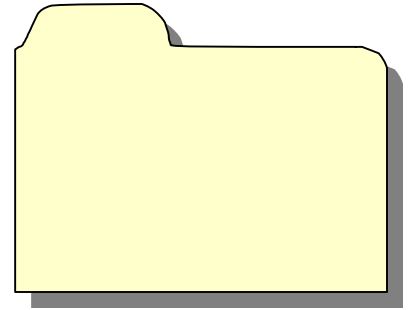
News letter No 2

And Then What?

"Have you given any thought to your future?" a father asked his young son. "Why sure, Dad, I've got it all figured out!" he exclaimed. "Tell me your plans, Son" inquired his father. "Well, after I leave school, I'll go to college." "Fine, Son - then what?" "After I leave college, I'll get a good paying job and buy a big house and a nice car," he replied. "Great, Son—then what?" "Then I'll marry and raise a family – just like YOU, Dad!" "Wonderful, Son - then what?" "Then, I'll continue to work until I am old enough to retire." "Excellent, Son - then what?" "Well, then I guess I'll live out my golden years travelling and enjoying my grandchildren." "Splendid idea, Son - then what?" Now feeling somewhat frustrated, his son replied, "Well, then I'll die of course!!" At this point, the father looked straight into the eyes of his son and asked one last time, "Okay, Son... **THEN WHAT??**" It is amazing how we plan so many things in our lives, yet

often fail to plan for that which is the most important. **We plan for the journey, but give no thought as to our destination!** Two things which are certain in this life are **NOT** death and taxes, but rather, **death** and the **judgment** to follow! "It is appointed for men to die once but after this the judgment" (Hebrews 9:27). Wise are those who prepare for appointments that they know they must keep. Death (unless the Lord comes first) and the judgment to come are two such unavoidable appointments (we see a preview of the judgment to come in Matthew 25:31-46, and Revelation 20:11-15 -- **Please Read!**). **It is also certain, according to the Scriptures, that beyond the judgment, eternity awaits....** Because of His great love, God sent His Son into the world that through Him we might not only be prepared for these inescapable appointments, but **ALSO that we might live eternally with Him in heaven.** "So Christ was offered once to bear the

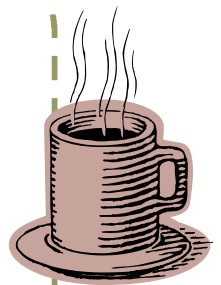
