The First Epistle of John (Week 52 – 1John 5:9-12)

Text: 1John 5:9-12 (ESV), "If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that he has borne concerning his Son. ¹⁰Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹² Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life."

- I. Review of 1John 5:6-8: The Testimony Concerning Jesus Christ
 - A. In the KJV, in 1John 5:7-8, the portion, "in heaven" to "in earth" is considered an interpolation
 - 1. It was not found in earlier Greek manuscripts
 - 2. It was never quoted by the early Christian apologists (Ante Nicean Fathers)
 - 3. KJV supporters feel this doctrine supports the trinity and that it is satanic to remove it from the Bible.
 - a. Other ways to prove the doctrine of Trinity:
 - i. Doctrine of Trinity God is one yet three distinct beings: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This doctrine acknowledges the deity of Christ and the personality of the Holy Spirit.
 - 1. Genesis 1:26 God said "Let us make man in our image..."
 - 2. John 1:1 the Word was with God and was God
 - ii. Doctrine of Arianism This doctrine denies that Jesus is God; He is God's first creation. It also denies the personality of the Holy Spirit (ex. Jehovah's Witnesses).
 - iii. Doctrine of Modalism Trinitarians believe that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit exist at the same time; Modalists do not (ex. United Pentecostal Church). They believe the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are the same person.
- II. The Testimony of God
 - A. 1John 5:9 (ESV), "If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that he has borne concerning his Son."
 - 1. We often receive and trust the testimony of men
 - a. For example:
 - i. We often trust what a sword-in witness says during a court trial
 - ii. We often trust what a family member, friend or neighbor tells us
 - iii. We often trust what a doctor tells us
 - iv. We often trust what a mechanic tells us
 - v. Unfortunately, we even find ourselves often trusting what a gossiper tells
 - 2. However, God's testimony is more trustworthy than man's testimony
 - a. Man's testimony can be flawed but God's testimony is perfect and always true!
 - b. God gave the testimony:
 - i. The water Jesus' baptism (Matt. 3:16-17)
 - ii. The blood Jesus' death (the amazing scenes that took place at His death)
 - iii. The Spirit The working of miracles (Acts 2:22; 10:38).

- 3. 1John 5:10a (ESV), "Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself..."
 - a. Question: What testimony is John referring to here?
 - i. God's testimony concerning Jesus being His Son (vs. 9b)
 - b. Question: What does the phrase "has the testimony in himself" mean?
 - i. Just as a man's thoughts and actions are impacted when he receives another man's testimony, a true believer's thoughts and actions are impacted when he receives God's testimony...
 - 1. God's testimony in him causes him to know that Christ is his Advocate (helper) and the propitiation of his sins (cf. 1John 2:1-2)
 - 2. God's testimony in him leads him to practice righteousness (cf. 1,John 3:7-10)
 - 3. God's testimony in him leads him obey God's word (cf. 1John 2:5)
 - **4.** God's testimony in him leads him to love the brethren (cf. 1John 4:7)
 - 5. God's testimony in him gives the assurance of eternal life (cf. 1,John 5:11)
 - 6. God's testimony, when received within us by the hearing, believing and obedience to the gospel of Jesus Christ, changes our lives, our behavior, our thoughts, our character and our hearts!
 - c. But what about those who do not receive the testimony of God?
 - i. 1John 5:10b says... "...Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son"
 - 1. Anyone who refuses to believe God's testimony of Jesus (like the Gnostics, who did not believe Jesus came by water AND blood) stand defiantly before God, calling Him a liar!
 - 2. Those who reject God's testimony stand condemned already because they do not believe in the name of God's Son (cf. John 3:18).
 - d. But those who have received God's testimony...
 - i. 1John 5:11-12 says... "And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. 12 Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life."
 - 1. Physical death is as a separation of body and spirit (cf. James 2:26) while physical life would be the opposite!
 - 2. Spiritual death is separation from God; Spiritual life (eternal life) is the opposite!
 - 3. Those who have God's testimony in them have spiritual life!
 - > The terror of death is replaced with the assurance of life!
 - ➤ Jesus said those who believe in Him, though they may physical die, will live (cf. John 11:25)
 - ➤ What an assurance! Which leads us to 1John 5:13... next week! ©
